Colossians 2:15 – “Having disarmed the powers and authorities, he made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them by the cross.”

Have you ever wondered what happened in the time between Jesus’ death on Good Friday and his glorious resurrection on Easter Sunday? Well, we answer that question every time we say the Apostles’ Creed, “He descended into hell.” After he died, Jesus descended into hell.

Wait a minute! Jesus descended into hell?!? When people go to hell, it’s because they are unbelieving sinners going to suffer an eternity of torment in the fires of hell, right? But you and I know Jesus was perfect. He never sinned. So why did Jesus descend into hell?

Colossians tells us. Jesus disarmed the powers and the authorities. By his death on the cross, Jesus defeated the power of sin and the devil. He won

for us the forgiveness of sins. The victory was his.

As the victor, Jesus made a spectacle of his enemies. He triumphed over the devil and his followers. Now, the Greek word for “triumph” literally means to lead someone as a prisoner in a triumphal proces-



sion. It refers to a triumph, which was a special celebration in Ancient Rome. In a triumph, the victorious Roman general would lead his soldiers and the defeated enemies through the streets of Rome. The Roman citizens would line the streets to celebrate this

festal procession.

Now, some might like to think that Jesus went to hell to continue his suffering. But Jesus’ agony ended on the cross. His descent into hell was his triumph. Though Satan had won the battle by bringing sin into the world, Christ won the war by shedding his innocent life on the cross. To celebrate his victory, Jesus went to hell. There, he proclaimed sin and the devil powerless. There, Christ displayed his complete deity and his almighty power. Jesus’ decent into hell served as evidence of his complete victory.

We know the rest of the story well. Jesus miraculously rose three days later as proof of his triumph over death. His resurrection leaves no doubt in our minds of his power. As our victorious Savior, he is now




